



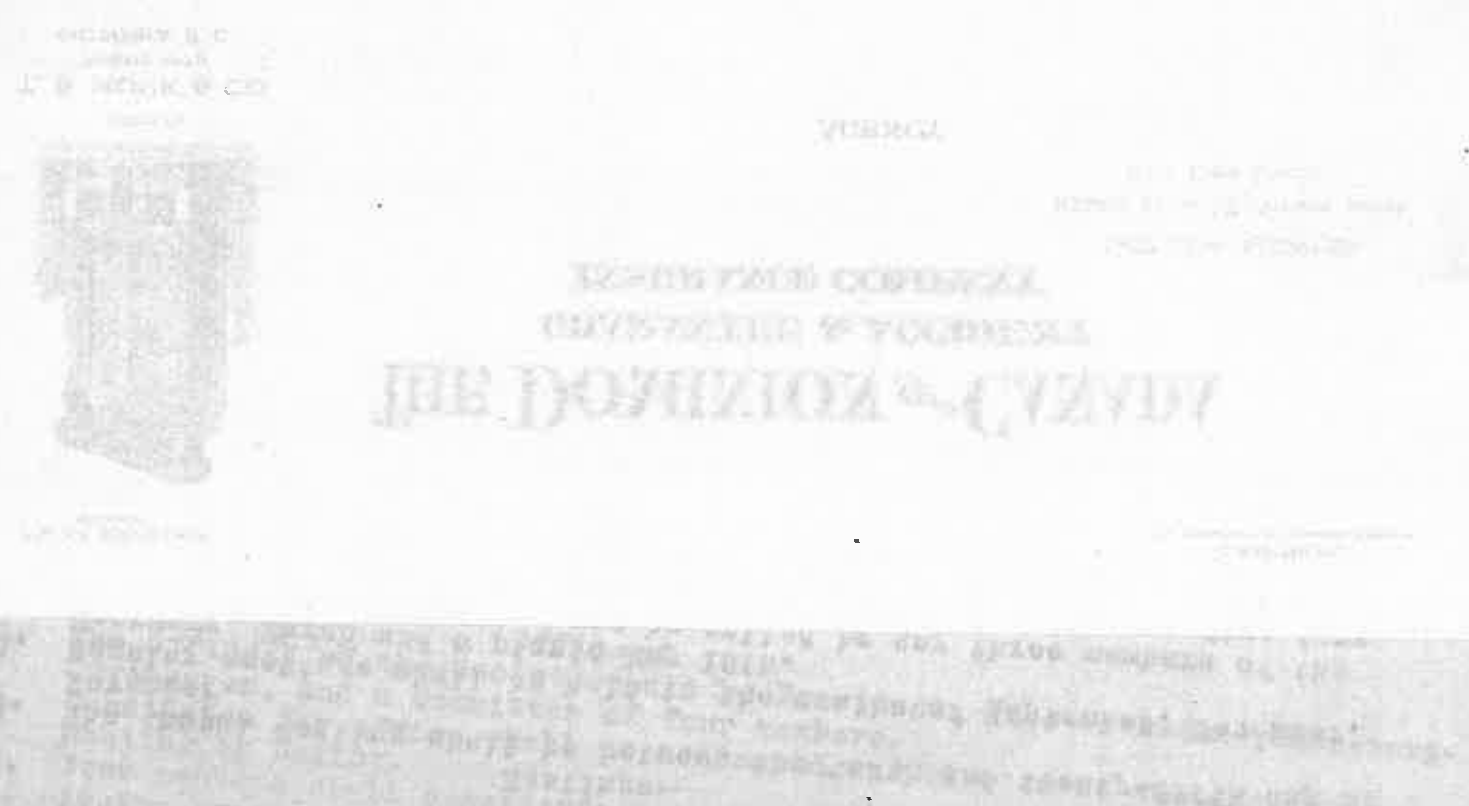

Constitution and By-Laws

of the

United Empire Loyalists Society of British Columbia.

1. The name of this organization shall be "The United Empire Loyalists Society of British Columbia.

Objects.

2. The objects of this Society shall be
 - (a) To perpetuate the memory of the United Empire Loyalists, their allegiance to the British flag, and the part they played in building Canada.
 - (b) To use every effort to have the true history of our country taught in our schools.

Membership

3. Active members in this Society shall consist of descendants of United Empire Loyalists.

Officers

4. The Officers of the Society shall be President, Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer, and a Committee of four members.
5. Candidates for office shall be nominated and elected at the Annual Meeting by ballot.
6. Four members shall constitute a quorum.
7. In the event of a vacancy occurring in any office, the Executive shall fill the office until the next Annual Meeting.

Meetings

8. The Annual Meeting shall be between the tenth and twenty-fifth day of November.
9. Regular meetings shall be held in the months of September, November, February, March and a picnic May 18th.
10. A special General Meeting may be called by any three members of the Executive or by any five members of the Society. At least five days notice to be given of the meeting.
11. Executive meetings shall be held at the call of the President.

Amendments.

12. Amendments may be made to this constitution by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any general meeting, providing notice has been given in writing five days previous to the meeting.

13. Meetings shall be conducted according to ordinary rules of procedure.

Fees.

14. The fee for Membership shall be \$1.00 yearly, payable at the Annual Meeting.
15. The Secretary-Treasurer shall present his annual financial report audited at the Annual Meeting.

United Empire Loyalists Hear Fine Addresses

The United Empire Loyalists' Society of British Columbia met on Thursday evening at 1513 Laurel Lane with a large number of members present. Mrs. E. C. Hart and Rev. George Dean were appointed members to the council of the Dominion Association. The speakers for the evening were Countess de Turczynowicz and Dr. Hart. The Countess, formerly Miss Laura Blackwell, of St. Catharines, Ont., is a descendant on her mother's side of a well-known Loyalist family, who came from Pennsylvania during the Revolutionary War and settled in the Niagara district. Her husband has musical studies in New York, later going to Germany, where she was in Grand Opera. Miss Blackwell met in Munich, the Polish Count de Turczynowicz, whom she married. For seven years before the outbreak of war they lived on their estates in Poland, and there their three children were born.

The speaker gave a very interesting address on the appreciation which the Polish people have of all things beautiful; their indomitable spirit which was so evident during their years of oppression by Russian, Austrian and Prussian forces; the endeavor of many of the aristocracy to provide education for their peasantry, in spite of violent opposition, the new system which is rising out of the old order, bringing into being a middle class.

For seven months during the war, which robbed her of her husband, the Countess and her children were kept prisoners in their own home, while Prussian soldiers occupied it. The trials of that time are vividly told in her book, "When the Prussians Came to Poland," which was one of the best sellers of the war books.

Massachusetts in the New England as in the old. In 1633, the first company of sixty men, women and children, including Stephen Hart, his wife and young children, took up their march westward through the unbroken forest, to start a new settlement on the Connecticut River. They encountered great hardships, and most of them turned back, but Mr. Hart and his family were among those who reached their objective. They settled at the place which has ever since been called by his name, Hartford, and the site of his original house is still pointed out. Before the next winter, 800 colonists had come to Hartford. Stephen Hart was a representative to the "General Court" for fifteen years, his son, Thomas, for twenty-four years, and Hawkins Hart, next in line, for eighteen years. The latter two also held the military rank of captain.

When the Revolutionary War came on, 20 of Stephen Hart's descendants fought on the American side. Four who had fought on the Loyalist side came north after the war was over and settled in Nova Scotia. Dr. Hart is the eighth generation from Stephen Hart.
